The Adviser may recoup any waived amount from the Fund pursuant to this agreement if such reimbursement does not cause the Fund to exceed existing expense limitations or the limitations in place at the time the reduction was originally made, and the reimbursement is made within three years after the date on which the Adviser incurred the expense.

Terms and Definitions

Active Share is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a manager's portfolio that differ from the benchmark index. Market Capitalization is the value of the fund as determined by the market price of its issued and outstanding stock. The Weighted Average Market Capitalization of a portfolio equals the average of each holding's market cap, weighted by its relative position size in the portfolio (in such a weighting scheme, larger positions have a greater influence on the calculation). The Weighted Median Market Capitalization is the median market capitalization of a fund's equity portfolio gives you a measure of the size of the companies in which an equity fund invests. It is the trimmed mean of the market capitalizations of the stocks in the fund's portfolio. Earnings growth rate is the amount of increase that a specific variable has gained within a specific period and context and is based on consensus estimates derived from FactSet as of 09/30/2023 for the 3-5 year period, and is not a measure of the Fund's future performance. Price-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is the ratio of the share of a company's stock compared to its per-share earnings. The Fund's Investor Class is used to calculate beta, a measure of the magnitude of a fund's past share price fluctuations in relation to the fluctuations in the stock market (as represented by the fund's benchmark).
